The Play

The Selfish Giant is a classic tale about a giant who builds a wall around his garden to keep out the town's children but in doing so plunges his garden into an endless winter. The show's creators instill a sense of urgency in the story by placing the storytellers themselves at a border wall. Traveling, depression-era hucksters, transform their wares to tell a much-needed story to the audience they find waiting to cross.

What children will learn...

This performance provides classrooms a unique opportunity to integrate multiple K-5 common core English Language Arts standards as it is an adaptation of a written fairytale by one of history's renowned writers.

Oscar Wilde's 130-year-old tale's close resemblance to struggles in the modern era teaches children the power of storytelling and its use as a means for both cultural and self-expression. This adaptation is about teaching children the importance of listening and learning from those that may seem different. It addresses the topic of walls not just from a physical but emotional and intellectual standpoint, ending the play with a poem:

"If you are feeling stuck behind a wall, remember, any enemy can become a friend because walls are just like stories and every story has an end."
